Pastor's Meditation - April 2024

"Someone's been ridin' with you."

My 1986 Jeep Cherokee plodded down pothole-laden Ridge Road, near Greece. The speed limit was 40 and I was keeping up with traffic, going close to 50. In the vehicle were our two children, aged 2 ½ and 3 months, and our foreign exchange student, Natalie, who

was nearly 18. It was technically Spring, 1997, but as is so often the case here in the Rochester area, it was cold, with snow on the ground. We were grocery shopping and running errands. After I pulled into my driveway to unload the kids and groceries, I remembered one more errand: the other car was in the shop and the bill needed to be paid. I asked Natalie to watch the kids for a few minutes while I went to pay the bill. She agreed. After the Jeep was unloaded, I backed out of the driveway and started down the road.

Suddenly, from the back of the Jeep came a loud crashing noise, followed by a dragging sound and everything stopped. I shut off the engine and got out. What happened?

My driver's side rear wheel had fallen completely off. It was in the middle of the street, still spinning up-and-down on its side. I pointed at the rotating wheel and started laughing, though I'm not sure why. I guess it was the nervous laughter of someone who just dodged a bullet. What were the odds? Had that wheel broken just a few minutes earlier on Ridge Road, with all the other traffic, what would've happened? Once the wheel was done spinning and rested on its side, I stood it up and rolled it to the shoulder of the road. I started up the hobbled Jeep, engaged the fourwheel drive and used the front wheels to "drag" it to the shoulder so it wouldn't block traffic.

My neighbor Don heard the loud noise and came running out. "What happened?"

"My wheel fell off," I told him.

"How?" Don dropped to the road and started looking under the Jeep, where the wheel had once been. Retired from General Motors and mechanically-inclined, he quickly found the problem. "Your axle spindle broke." He showed me the cylindrical spindle, about the thickness of a quarter. On the end, there was a shiny area, less than the width of a dime. "That shiny area is where the break happened. The dull area is where it was already broken. You've been riding on a busted axle for who-knows-how-long."

"Wow!" I exclaimed.

"Someone's been ridin' with you."

It took a few seconds for that comment to sink in. Don was not, far as I knew, a religious man. But he clearly meant God, or an Angel, was riding with us. Some divine being was in the Jeep when we were precariously barreling over the Ridge Road potholes. And that someone had kept us safe. Other than \$400 to fix the spindle, that Godly being had delivered all of us, unharmed. About 7 months later, God called me to be a mnister.

Decades later, I still wonder who (or what) was there that I could not see. I think about the men on the road to Emmaus (in the gospel of Luke) who walked for awhile with Jesus and had no clue. The Epistle of Hebrews tells us: "Don't forget to show hospitality to strangers, for some who have done this have

entertained angels without realizing it!" Whatever we see, scripture gives us the impression that there's more there than meets the eye.

As I experience life, has God or God's angels been riding with me? More importantly, "Have I been riding with God and the angels?" It's a question we all should ponder. Are we expecting God to be here to protect us, or are we here to serve God? Jesus said, "I am with you always." Who is riding with us? And, more importantly, who are we riding with?

MISSIONS REPORT

Many thanks to all our church family who came out to the Saturday, March 2nd Spring Into Action food drive for the Penfield Ecumenical Food Shelf. Once again the PEFS volunteers, who helped to unload a full SUV of your generous Easter dinner box items. expressed their gratitude and appreciation congregation to our for recognizing and responding to the increasing needs of the Penfield community they serve.

PEFS is facing a 30% increase in the number of families accessing their service along with a 30% increase in the amount of food they are purchasing distributing. and supplemental food relief organization serves the 14526 and 14625 zip codes, in addition to families of children in the Penfield School District. Their mission is to alleviate food insecurity in the Penfield community by providing nutritious food to those in need, in a compassionate, respectful and judgmental manner. PEFS is governed by an all-volunteer board and run solely by volunteer staff. The Missions Team is happy to support these dedicated volunteers at PEFS, but we couldn't do it without you.

During March we also presented the American Baptist Church's annual America for Christ offering. Your donations to this offering impact the needs of people in the United States and Puerto Rico. We hope you took a few minutes to read the various stories in the bulletin inserts. Susie Sparnecht also shared a very heartfelt connection to how this

funding has made a positive difference in her hometown, Youngstown, Ohio. So many people in our country who have great needs are being helped with food, health and educational programs, clothing, senior services and socialization opportunities and more. Thanks to this support they are lifted and are reminded that they are not forgotten.

Habitat Update

On Sunday, March 17th we welcomed *Gareth Evans, the Associate Director of Development and Volunteer Engagement at Greater Rochester Habitat for* Humanity to Adult Discussion. Since 1997 our church has sponsored over 20 Habitat houses in the JOSANA neighborhood of Rochester as a member of the Penfield Coalition of Churches for Habitat. In January 2023 we joined with 5 other faith-based coalitions to form **Greater Rochester Interfaith Builders (GRIB).** GRIB's mission is to finance and build a Habitat home every year.

• Our first house is 108 Ackerman St, Rochester, NY 14609, in the Beechwood neighborhood. If you are interested in working on the building of 108 Ackerman St., go to **grhabitat.org** and look for the "Faith" tab under Construction Volunteering. Once there you can sign up to volunteer and see photos of our groundbreaking and wall-raising ceremonies and the latest building updates.

Habitat for Humanity ReStores are nonprofit home improvement stores and donation centers that sell new and gently used furniture, appliances, building materials and more to the public at a fraction of the price. Each donated item keeps quality and usable items out of the landfill, and each item sold is a great deal for customers that generates money to further GR Habitat for Humanity's mission. Volunteering might include greeting and assisting customers, organizing donations

and displays, assisting at the sales counter, and receiving donations or picking up donations.

In 1804 our church was established as the Baptist Church of Northfield. After Northfield was renamed Boyle, and Penfield was carved out of it in 1810, our church was renamed the Baptist Church of Penfield. That name continued until 1974 when the congregation became concerned that some other group might incorporate as the First Baptist Church of Penfield. So, we officially registered as First Baptist Church of Penfield that year.
