## Pastor's Meditation September 2023

Then the Lord reached out his hand and touched my mouth and said to me, "I have put my words in your mouth." (Jeremiah 1:9)

I write September's meditation in August 2023, which marks the anniversary of important days for two distinguished men of faith. 60 years ago, on August 28, 1963, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. gave his famous, "I Have a Dream" sermon from the steps of

the Lincoln Memorial. 1560 years earlier, August 28, 403, a well-known sinner named Augustine went to Heaven.

Though the two events are hundreds of years apart, both are remarkable displays of God's power. Much attention has been devoted to King's strong oratory and singing rhetoric in that famous speech. In recent years it was revealed that after the 7<sup>th</sup> paragraph, the entire "I have a dream" section of the speech, was unscripted. Imagine!

The speech seemed cutting-edge in its day. But now, much of it seems like common sense. When King said, "We must not allow our creative protests to degenerate into physical violence," that's common sense. quoted the Declaration When he Independence, "we hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal," that's common sense. Today, it is instinctive "I have a dream when my for us to think: four little children will live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character." It just seems right. Anyone could have had this dream, anyone could have said these words, but until God inspired it, and King dared vocalize it in extemporaneous fashion, nobody had.

To some of those living in 1963, those who were schooled in the destructive practice of racism, King's words were very unwelcome, like a bright light shining into the room of one

who is in a deep sleep. This is what we hope for when God calls men and women; that God would shine some light that takes ourselves and others to the place that God wants us to be; the place that is right.

Augustine was another minister whom God inspired. In his early life he was a worldly man, caught up in lust and greed. He felt the Spirit nudging him to change, but the best prayer he could offer was: "Da mihi castitatem et continentiam, sed noli modo ("Give me chastity and continence, but not just yet!")

But then, after years of ignoring God, Jesus, the Light of the World, shone into his life and he could see how asleep he was: "I was in misery, and misery is the state of every soul overcome by friendship with mortal things and lacerated when they are lost. Then the soul becomes aware of the misery which is its actual condition even before it loses them."

Following his conversion, Augustine felt called to be a priest. People grumbled because they knew the sinful man he had formerly been. In order to answer their critique, he wrote *Confessions*, a masterpiece of spiritual literature. He confessed his sins publicly, and displayed God's grace in his life. Like the "I Have a Dream" speech, today much of *Confessions* seems instinctive and intuitive. For his confessions, Augustine was made Bishop of Hippo, on the Northern coast of Africa (present-day Algeria) where he served for 35 years, writing volumes of work, and becoming one of the church's great

theologians. Then, on August 28, 430, he entered into eternal Light.

Augustine and King would probably not agree on everything, and neither was a perfect man. But one thing they had in common was God's ability to speak through them. Each time we speak, we should ask for God to give us the words. God takes ordinary people, gives them uncommon things to do, and even gives them extraordinary words to say.

With the help of Pastor Steve, the Missions Team has confirmed some very special speakers for the upcoming **2nd hour** programming. Two of these will be on Zoom, so you will be able to hear and see the speakers from home if you cannot get to church.

On September 17, 2023, Reverend Jen Lessard, Pastor of York, NY Baptist Church, will join our congregation via Zoom during 2nd hour, to discuss her recent trips to Ecuador. Jen has made a powerpoint to go along with all that she wants to share with us about her experiences there.

On September 24, 2023, Toya Richards, ABC-USA International Ministries global servant to South Africa, will join our congregation via Zoom during 2nd Hour. Toya has experience in print journalism and communications. She will be a professor at the Cape Town Baptist Seminary, teaching intermediate to advanced English language

Paul Vick grew up in Rochester, NY and graduated from James Monroe High School, but even before all of that he was the youngest sole survivor of a commercial plane crash.
