Pastor's Meditation - September 2024

Thomas Merton (1915-1968) was a glib, Ivyleague-educated, literary and worldly man who inexplicably felt God's calling to withdraw from society and become a Trappist monk. Trappist monks lead a simple life, and mostly practice silence (no talking). And he found a monastic home at the Abbey of Our Lady of Gethsemani near Bardstown, Kentucky.

After years of silence and solitude, he was given the opportunity to visit nearby Louisville. He wrote:

"In Louisville, at the corner of Fourth and Walnut, in the center of the shopping district, I was suddenly overwhelmed with the realization that I loved all these people, that they were mine and I theirs, that we could not be alien to one another even though we were total strangers. It was like waking from a dream of separateness, of spurious self-isolation in a special world.

This sense of liberation from an illusory difference was such a relief and such a joy to me that I almost laughed out loud. I have the immense joy of being man, a member of a race in which God Himself became incarnate. As if the sorrows and stupidities of the human condition could overwhelm me, now that I realize what we all are. And if only everybody could realize this! But it cannot be explained. There is no way of telling people that they are all walking around shining like the sun.

Then it was as if I suddenly saw the secret beauty of their hearts, the depths of their hearts where neither sin nor desire nor self-knowledge can reach, the core of their reality, the person that each one is in God's eyes. If only they could all see themselves as they really are. If only we could see each other that way all the time. There would be no more war, no more hatred, no more cruelty, no more

greed. But this cannot be seen, only believed and 'understood' by a peculiar gift."

By withdrawing from the world for a time, Merton was able to visit the world again to see people in the loving way God does. In a small way, a church retreat can help us replicate Merton's experience. First Baptist Church's retreat is November 2nd, at East Rochester's Eyer Park, Quinzi Lodge, 10am – 4pm. Mark the date. The retreat takes place just before the election. Lord willing, we will benefit from this opportunity to quiet ourselves and "see" each other, even during this season of tumult.

MISSIONS REPORT

During September the Missions Team will be presenting the American Baptist Churches' Annual Offering: The 2024 World Mission Offering (WMO). This year the scripture is from Luke 24:32, "Were not our hearts burning within us?" We will be sharing video messages of how missionaries are working to share God's message globally and to bring help, hope, and healing through International Ministries, also known as the American Baptist Foreign Mission Society.

Our team is pleased to bring you an update to what we had reported as the total amount donated for **One Great Hour of Sharing**. Bill Werther shared with us that the new final total was \$2,178.37! Again, we thank you all for your generosity as our congregation joins many others to support the four Annual Offerings of the American Baptist Churches USA.

At our August meeting our team discussed various local organizations, most of which our congregation has supported in the past. We authorized \$500 to be sent to **Habitat for Humanity**; \$500 to be sent to **Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity School**, and \$300 to support **Refugees Helping Refugees** as they continue to support each other and get children ready for school again.

We outlined some other organizations which the Missions Team typically supports in the fall, such as **Willow** in October for "Domestic Violence Month," the **Penfield Ecumenical** Food Shelf in November to assist in their extra demands during the holiday season, and the Open Door Mission in December to support their mission of ministering to the needs of so many of our neighbors as the cold winter weather arrives. Please note that we have moved our RING IN THE HOLIDAYS drive-thru food and pajama collection to Saturday, November 9th. We are looking forward to this project again, and will have details in the October Carillon.
