Historian's Corner

Another memorial stained-glass window in our sanctuary is that of Harvey Fuller. Harvey was a Deacon of this church for 43 years (1836 - 1879) and brother of Rev. Timothy Fuller.

Notes from the Trustees

- Four Ring security cameras and operating positioned of early as September. The cameras are located in the second floor hallway facing the corridor to the sanctuary, one in Old Fellowship Hall, a flood light camera facing the PVNS playground and one aimed at the dumpsters and shed. There ongoing problem with been an construction and household items, which are not church related, filling the dumpster. We now have a better chance of identifying those individuals.
- Recently a sick tree was removed from the custodian's house at 1866 Penfield Road. A year ago last December this tree lost a large limb that did considerable damage to the house and property. In August of this year another large branch fell, no damage this time, only a large mess to clean up.
- The mold and asbestos remediation is nearly completed. Soon drywall will be installed and painted in the men's bathroom off OFH and in room 16 (just below the bathroom). A new floor will be installed in room 16 as well as the hallway between the sanctuary and OFH. This has been a large project spearheaded by David Trump.
