<u>Pastor's Meditation</u> November, 2024

At this time exactly 50 years ago, famous Christian writer, priest and Ivy League professor Henri Nouwen was residing in Piffard, NY just about an hour from Penfield, doing a six-month residency at the Abbey of the Genesee. He kept a journal of his time there, which was later published as *The Genesee Diary**.

1974 was a tumultuous year, beginning with an OPEC embargo leftover from the previous year that led to an energy crisis. In April, there was a "Super Outbreak" of tornadoes (148 tornadoes in the U.S. and Ontario, Canada during April 3-4, which remains the 2nd largest tornado outbreak in recorded history). The news was predominated by a presidential scandal that culminated in impeachment proceedings, the resignation and subsequent pardon of the president. Fifty years later, things have really calmed down, haven't they? :-)

Even though Nouwen attempted to withdraw from the world by living with a group of silence-practicing, bread-baking Catholic monks, the news kept intruding and threatening his peace of mind. His journal entries reflect his worries. But his Thanksgiving entry is one that is relatively free from national news. Thanksgiving that year was November 28th, the same as it will be this year. Nouwen wrote:

Thanksgiving is a most American day. It seems to me the day which the people of this nation know how to celebrate best. It is a family day, a day of hospitality, a day of gratitude. It is a day that — unlike Father's

Day, Mother's Day and Christmas Day – has escaped commercialization. It is the day that makes me desire to be with a family here. Thanksgiving is, first of all, a North American feast. This nation is affluent and has more than it needs. The realization that what we have is a free gift can deepen our desire to share this gift with others who cry for help. When we bless the fruits of the harvest, let us at least realize that blessed fruits need to be shared. Otherwise, the blessing turns into a curse.

The late Oscar Jackson, my former barber, had a great deal of insight into the human condition (like a lot of barbers, I suppose). Years ago, while we watched news of a U.S.' bombing in Syria, during one of his haircuts/therapy sessions, Oscar observed, "We're a rich nation. Trouble is, we can't enjoy it." Perhaps Nouwen had the best insight as to why we can't enjoy it. Money and material goods are a blessing, but holding onto our blessings becomes a curse. It is only through sharing that we discover gratitude again.

Perhaps this is one reason why Jesus encouraged us to share our goods with the poor. We read in Matthew 25: "Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world, 35 for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, 36 I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." 37 Then the

righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food or thirsty and gave you something drink? 38 And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you or naked and gave you clothing? 39 And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited vou? , 40 And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me.' This Thanksgiving, make the most of the material goods with which we are blessed. Keep the blessing from becoming a curse - by sharing them with those who have less.


